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What's been happening...

Fairies, Unicorns, and Dragons, Oh My!!!

During Week 5 the OshClub children enjoyed a Mythical Creatures themed week. Each day during the week we did activities based on different mythical creatures.

On Monday we had a fairy day, Tuesday was Unicorns, Wednesday was Dragons, Thursday was the Loch Ness Monster and Friday was Bunyips.

The children made flying fairy racers and fairy dolls and for unicorns they created unicorn puppets that slid down or flew over the rainbow. They also created some clothes peg unicorn puppets which were very popular for dramatic play. Dragon day saw us engage in activities that were centred around the children's book "Dragons Love Tacos" we even had a build your own taco bar set up for afternoon tea.

Whilst exploring about the Loch Ness Monster the children created some amazing floating Loch Ness Monsters they could use in their bath or water play. These were created using pool noodle offcuts and some pipe cleaners. The children loved racing them in our water trough. During Bunyip Day we explored what mythology exists in Australia, this included investigating Bunyips and other Indigenous Mythological Creatures such as Australian Brownies known as Junjarins, Mullokas, Moora Mooras, Tintookies, Lallagullis, Tookonies, and Woorails.

Th children were very interested in the fact that Australia had its own type of Fairies however the topic that most caught their attention was the Loch Ness Monster. This may be a topic we need to explore further if the children remain interested.

Glass Slipper Decorating

Recipe

Coco Inspired Sugar Skull Empanadas

1 pkt of short crust pastry 500gr lean mince 1 can of baked beans

- 1 can of sweet corn kernels
- 1 sachet of taco seasoning 1 jar of sliced black olives 2 eggs beaten Tomato sauce Black and Red edible ink pens

Defrost pastry and use a round cutter to cut out circle shapes approx. 8.5cm in diameter

Preheat oven or air fryer to 180 degrees

Mix eggs and tomato sauce together in a bowl

Brown the mince and then mix in the baked beans, corn and taco seasoning. Heat through until combined and mince is fully cooked.

Place dessert spoon of mince mixture into middle of half the pastry circles. Place remainder of pastry circles on top and seal edges using a fork.

Place two olives on top of pastry for eyes and wash over entire top of pastry with egg wash.

Place on tray lined with baking paper and bake in oven for 15 mins or until golden brown.

Remove from oven and let cool slightly

Use edible ink pens to add in eye details, nose and mouth.
